There will be a focus on practical implementation and processes for those rolling out TNR programs on a wide scale.

Elizabeth Jensen will facilitate a wide ranging and and inclusive discussion with Jane Hoffman, President of the Mayor's Alliance for NYC's Animals. Jane Hoffman helped found the <u>Mayor's</u> <u>Alliance for NYC's Animals</u> (the Alliance) in 2002 and has served as president ever since. The Alliance was created to work with the City of New York to apply creative, targeted solutions to NYC's homeless animal crisis. Working pursuant to a 10-Year Strategic Plan (2005-2014), and with 150+ rescue groups and shelters that now participate in the Alliance, the Alliance has succeeded in reducing euthanasia at city shelters.
